ABOUT HAND CRAFTED TILES





Above is an image of the type of variation that may occur between two tiles of the same design and size. The differences may occur for a variety of reasons:

- They are being painted by two different artists.
- They are being located in different parts of a kiln during firing, whereby one tile was fired at a slightly higher temperature than the other, causing the glaze to spread out slightly more than the other tile.
- They may be from two lots painted months apart, where the artist will paint slightly differently.
- Also, with solid color tiles and molded pieces, slight variations may occur in shade from lot to lot.
- The cobalt blues applied to decorated tiles varies in darkness according to the thickness of the application of the glaze. The thicker the application, the closer the color approximates our cobalt field tile. The thinner the application, the closer it approximates our blue field tile.
- The formulation of glazes for a solid color varies greatly between the tile and the molded piece, due to the latter's much higher firing temperature. Some variations in color may therefore occur.
- The image show above is by far an exception most decorated tiles have differences between them that are much less apparent to perceive. Please do take into consideration however the nature of this product when sampling and purchasing.

This is a handcrafted ceramic product. Variation in size, color, shape, design and surface quality are inherent and are desirable aspects of this product. Please work from several different cartons for best results. No returns or adjustments will be made after installation. Installation constitutes acceptance.

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
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INTRODUCTION

he history of Mexican Talavera tiles began in the late 16th Century when potters from the Spanish city of Talavera de la Reina settled in Puebla, a two hour drive east of Mexico City.

Today, Talavera ceramics are found throughout the country, but the finest are still concentrated in and around Puebla, where many of our products are sourced.

Compared to other Mexican tile imports, our tiles possess a vibrance of color, a delicacy of detail, and visible textures that comes from hand painting. Each tile is its own work of art.

Mexican Talavera tile has been loved for years by many, for its folkloric aesthetics and rustic appearance. Traditional Mexican Talavera tile however has it limitations. It is created on a artisan red clay body that cannot be used outdoors in harsher climates. Also, with many sources of talavera tile, designs vary little from a dozen or two common patterns, surface textures are flat, and colors mute.

Latin Accents has transformed Mexican talavera tile with vibrant colors and rich earth tones, dozens of unique and creative designs, and an innovation most important of all: a durable porcelain tile body suitable for use in swimming pools and outdoor installations in all climates. We import into Mexico a European porcelain body that is then hand painted by artists. We have further innovated by creating a variety of porcelain molded pieces to provide complete solutions for the varied installation needs of our customers.

With our new Catalina line, we again break new ground by creating designs that compliment the subtle earth tones found in most homes in America.

The Contemporary Hacienda is organized so that it serves as a design gallery, a product catalog and a reference manual for our products. Installation photos and product images are show throughout the book and grouped by theme. At the end there is an index that lists page numbers for locating product images.

OUR CATALINA LINE

What in Southern California is commonly known as Catalina tile, or also Malibu tile, comes from the California revival movement of the early 20th century.

Using a centuries old European technique called Cuerda Seca, but originating in the Middle East, a design of lines is applied to pre-glazed tiles through the use of a silk screen process. An oily substance called "wax-resist" is used to make the lines, which can be pigmented or not, to act as a barrier to water based glazes that are applied by rubber syringes. The result is that the colored glaze is confined between the wax resist lines and creates a notable texture.

Latin Accents brings new innovations to this California tradition, an all weather porcelain body to allow for outdoor installations anywhere, and subtle earth tone colors, to compliment the natural colors of the Western landscape.

Once produced in a factory on Catalina Island, 22 miles off shore from Los Angeles, Catalina tile adorns the serpentine wall that snakes along Crescent Avenue, the Wrigley Memorial and Botanical Gardens, the old Bird Park aviary, benches, storefronts, fountains and numerous homes and buildings around the town.

For only a decade, from 1927 to 1937, functional tile and decorative pottery were produced by residents at the Catalina Clay Products Co., where as many as 70 workers were employed, doing everything from collecting red clay from pits in the rugged interior to designing shapes and mixing colors, forming the clay into square tile or distinctly shaped pottery, firing it in kilns, and selling it at local tourist shops.

Today the pottery has become a collector's item, prized by aficionados for its distinctive glaze and colors. Around Avalon, most of the tiles are authentic but some, succumbing to age or the elements, have been replaced by high-quality reproductions.

Typically, Catalina decorative tiles depict pastoral island scenes or animals, most commonly brightly colored fish or birds, as in the murals at Bird Park. Other tiles are molded into abstract or Moorish-style patterns, in rounded or star-like shapes. Many emulate the Art-Deco style in vogue in the 1920s.

Plumeada, or "feathered" is a specialized hand painting technique found extensively in elaborate Talavera pottery in Puebla, Mexico, but able to be done well only after long periods of training.



It can be found in dinnerware designs, pots, vases, plaques and on some of the tile designs in our Poblana line.

Latin Accents has taken this effect as an inspiration for its new design, "Plumeada", adapting it for uniformity over multiple tile installations





Puebla became for over two centuries the center of production for tile in Mexico, and remains the only place in which ceramic studios can receive official certification by the government as creators of authentic Talavera ceramics. The name Talavera comes from the town of Talavera de la Reina in central-west Spain, where a variation of the Italian Majolica (or Mayolica) ceramic was created. Majolica and Talavera share a tin oxide white glaze as their base.

Latin Accents is unique from all other tile manufacturers and importers in that we have combined this ancient tradition of tile decoration with European ceramic technology in ways that respond to the aesthetic and installation demands of most of North America and Europe. No other Talavera tile has undergone the laboratory tests that ours have to assure its ability for installation in all climates, and for resistance to pool chemicals. No other Mexican tile has been designed to complement the subtle earth toned ceramics and stone commonly used throughout homes in the US. In addition, no other Latin ceramic enterprise offers a compliment of molding and trim products, in both traditional clay and all weather porcelain, to meet your designer's demands for both exterior and interior tile installations.

(29 in Hg) for 20 minutes, then covered with water for additional 40 minutes under the same vacuum condition. After removal from the chamber, the samples were subjected to fifteen cycles of freezing to 0° F and thawing to 50° F to 60° F water. After each cycle the specimens were wiped surface dry and observed for surface flaws, then reimmersed in water until ready for the next freezing cycle. Every fifth cycle the tile were weighed and inked to enhance surface flaws.

Before starting, substrates must be cleaned to remove curing compounds, sealers, soil, mortar, dirt, dust, etc. Curing compounds or sealers must be removed by bead-blasting, grit / sand blasting, hydro blasting, diamond wheel grinder with dustless vacuum attachment, or equivalent methods of mechanical scarifying. After removal of the curing compounds and sealers, all rough, uneven or "out-of-plumb" surfaces must be made "plumb and true" to within 1/4" in 10' (6 mm in 3 m) and 1/16" in 1' (1.5 mm 300 mm) using LATICRETE 3701 Fortified Mortar Bed. Dry or dusty concrete or masonry surfaces must be water washed and excess water removed just prior to the application of LATICRETE installation materials.

EXPANSION AND CONTROL JOINTS

Existing joints in subsurface must be carried through tile work and must conform to architectural details. Expansion joints must be installed where tile abuts restraining surfaces, such as perimeter walls and corners. Expansion joints must be installed at all "changes of plane" in the tile work. MIXING

Mix each LATICRETE product according to printed product instructions printed on / included with each product package. Mix only long enough to wet out the batch. Do not over-mix.

INSTALLATION OF TALAVERA PORCELAIN TILES BY THE THIN BED METHOD

Apply the thin bed mortar to the substrate with scraping motion, using the flat side of the notched trowel. Work the thin bed mortar into good contact with the substrate. A trowel with notches large enough to ensure full coverage and support of the tile is required. Using the notched side of the trowel, comb the thin bed mortar in one direction. Firmly press the tiles into the fresh thin bed mortar and move them perpendicularly across the ridges to flatten and compress the ridges. This helps to

produce maximum coverage to the backs of the tiles and leaves the corners and edges fully supported. Do not apply more thin bed mortar than can be covered within 10-15 minutes, or while thin bed mortar is still wet and tacky. Periodically, remove and check tiles to verify full thin bed mortar coverage is being achieved. Allow tile installation to set for 24 hours at 70° F (21° C), prior to grouting. Excess thin bed mortar must be cleaned from tiles with a clean, wet cloth or sponge while it is still fresh.

GROUTING AND POINTING JOINTS

Joints must be packed full and free of all voids and pits. Excess grout must be cleaned from the surface of the tiles as the work progresses, while the grout is fresh and before it hardens. The day after installation residual cement grout film or haze must be removed using a neutral pH detergent solution. Epoxy grout haze should be removed the same day as indicated in the printed product instructions. No acids should be used for cleaning tile work.

PROTECTION

Allow cement grout to cure for a minimum of 7 days at 70° F (21° C) before exposure to rain. Allow epoxy grout to cure for 2 days at 70° F (21° C) before exposure to rain.

COLD WEATHER NOTE

The curing of installation materials is retarded by low temperatures and finished work should be protected for an extended period of time. Typically, for every 18° F below 70° F (10°C below 21°C), installation materials take twice as long to cure.

WET AREA NOTE

When using LATICRETE latex Portland cement grout, allow tile work in swimming pools and fountains to cure for 14 days at 70° F (21° C) before exposing to water immersion.
